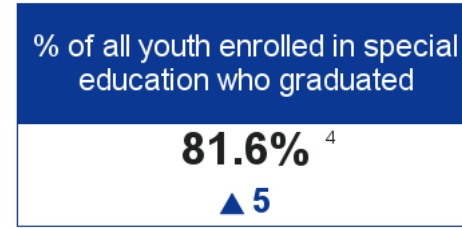
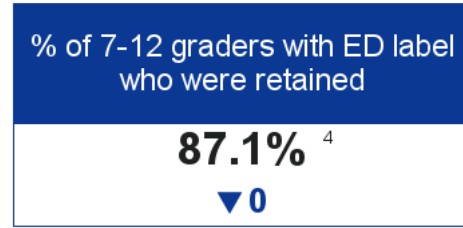
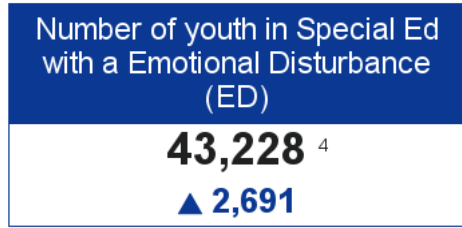
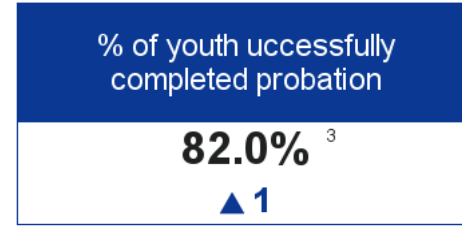
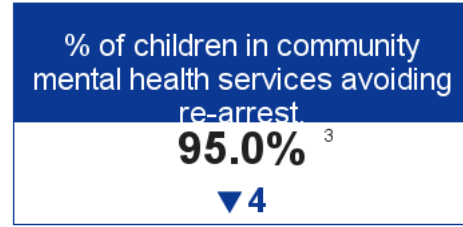
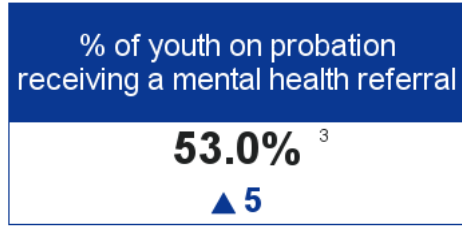
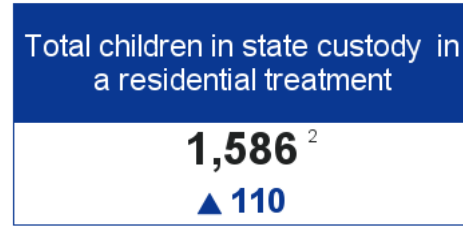
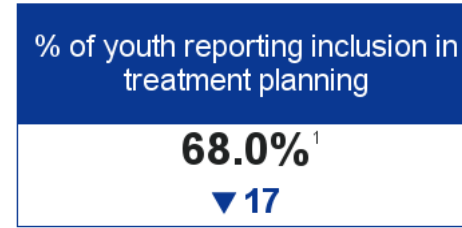




Welcome to the Texas System of Care Data Dashboard. The goal of the dashboard project is to report data reflecting child and adolescent mental health and wellness in Texas.

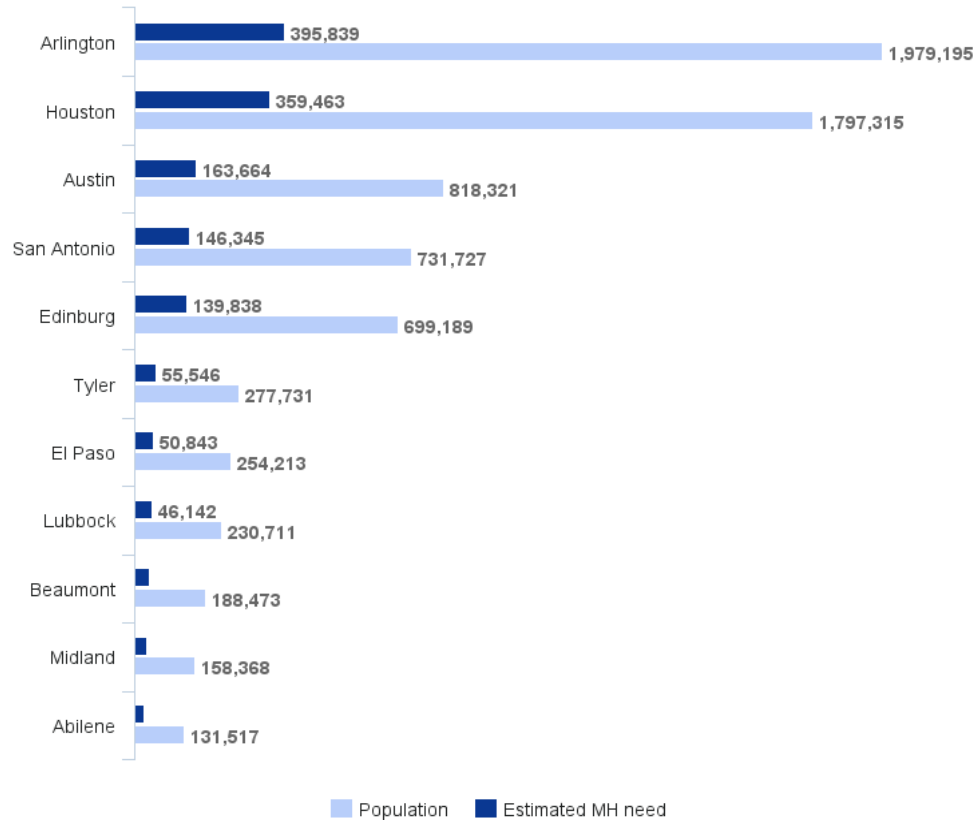

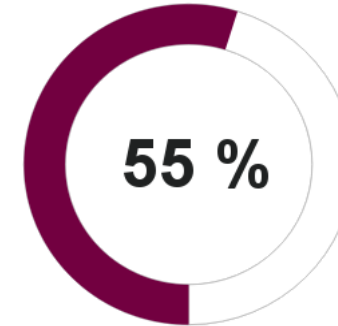

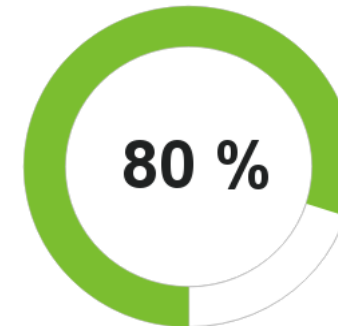

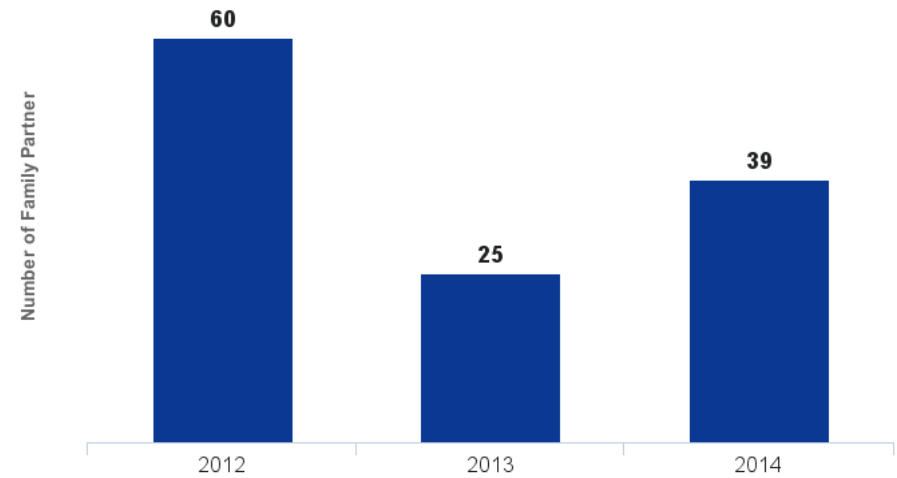

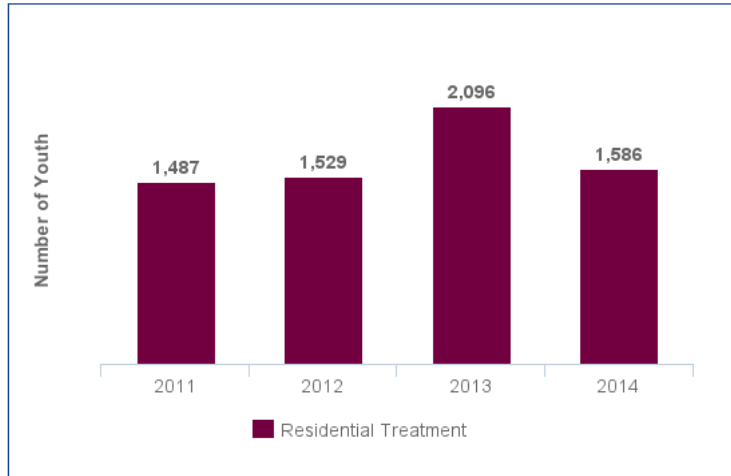
Number of new certified family partners each year



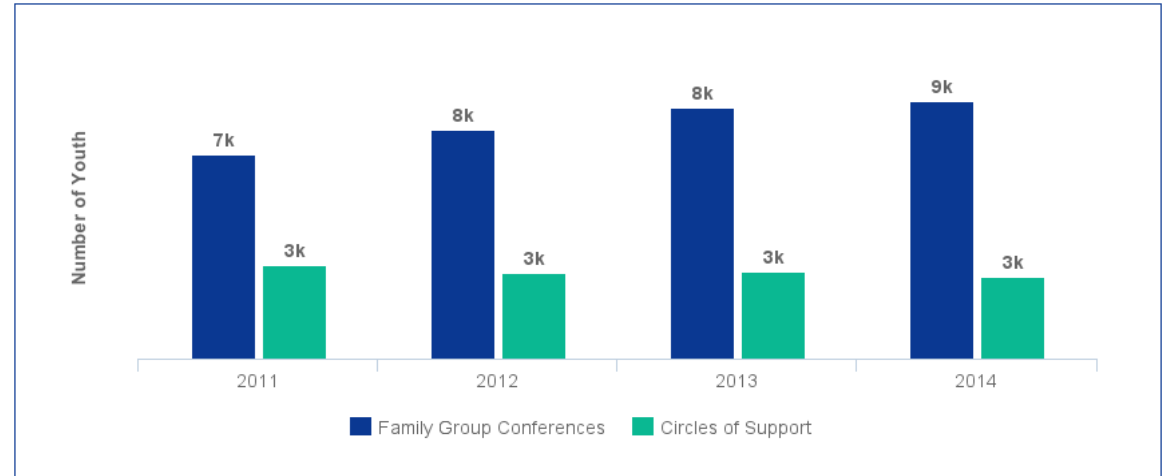


Child Welfare Actions for selected regions

Residential Treatment Trend by Year

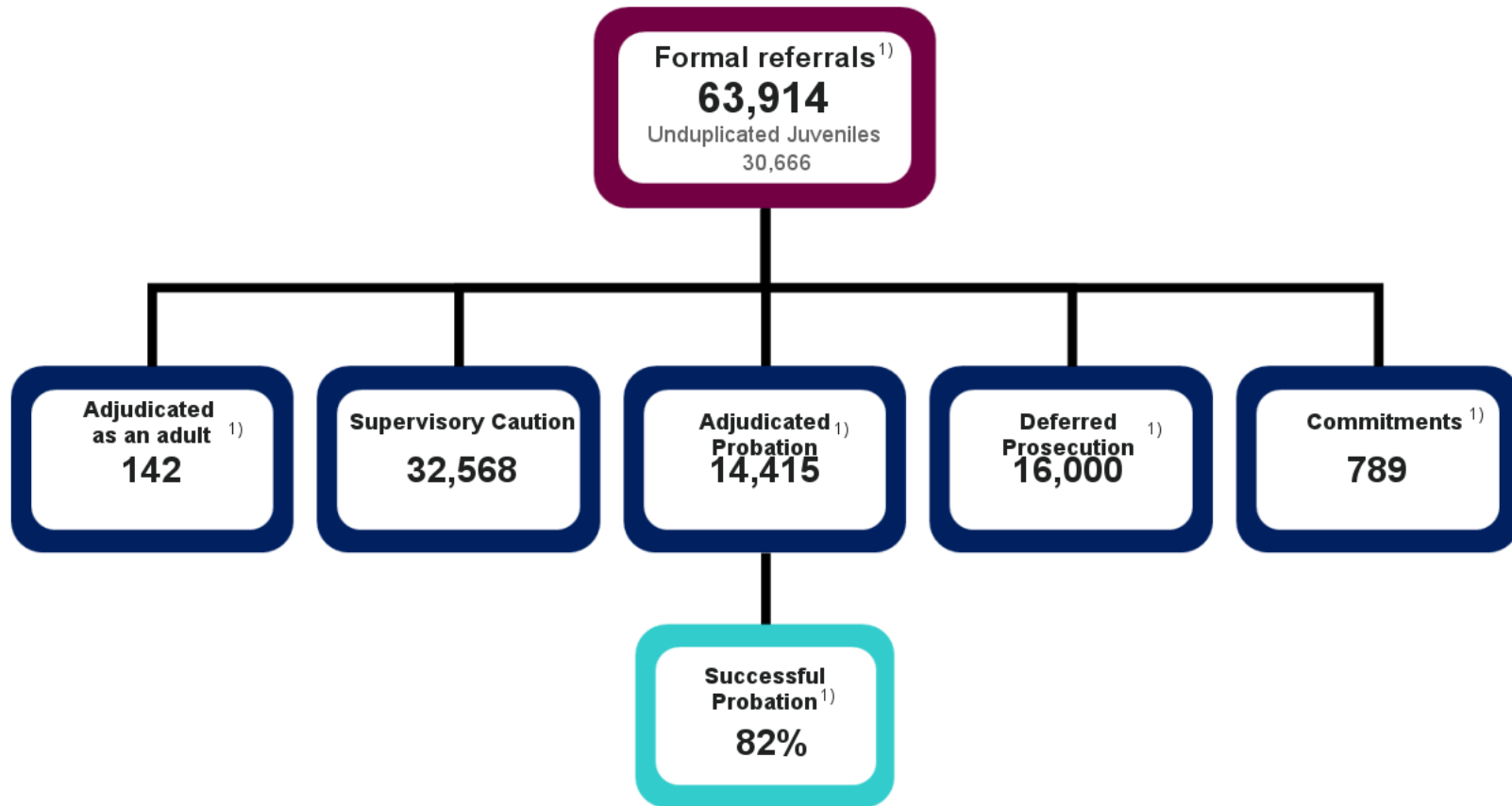


Use of Care Coordination by Year



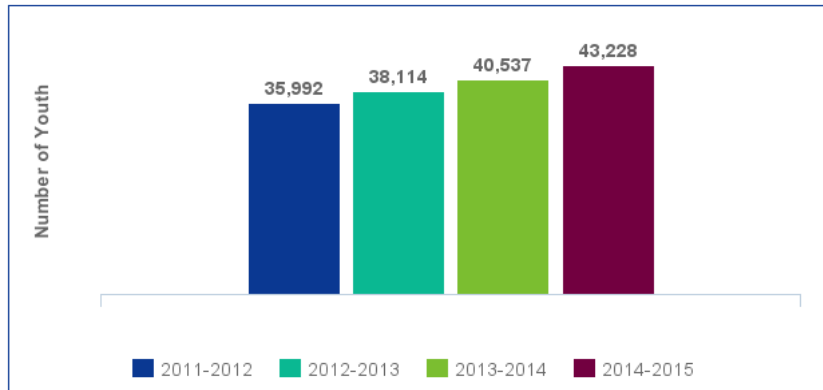
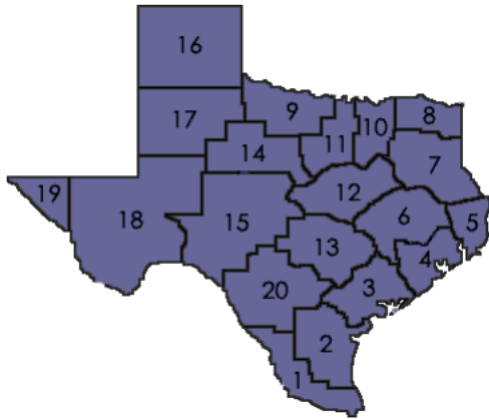
